BLANKET BAY LODGE GLENORCHY, NEW ZEALAND

According to Maori legend, Lake Wakatipu was formed when a warrior saved his princess from the clutches of a sleeping giant. The warrior surrounded the giant with burning kindling, melting the snow from the Southern Alps and forming a lake in the shape of the sleeping giant. Today the inland lake rises and falls every eight minutes, which is said to be the beating of the giant's heart. Blanket Bay Lodge is the lake's second

legend. Fly in low over the lake before alighting to paradise. You'll be greeted with a cocktail in the lodge's stone and wood den before being shown to your private chalet.

VOMO ISLAND RESORT, FIJI





Breakfast is served at sunrise on the island's mountain top, where both the view and the strawberry pancakes make it worth the hike. OBEROI AMARVILAS AGRA, INDIA

The Taj Mahal is all about love. Built by Shah Jahan as a monument to his dead wife, Mumtaz Mahal, it took more than 20,000 workers and craftsmen 22 years to complete. Finished in 1648, it still stands today. What better place to celebrate your love?

The Oberoi Amarvilas sits just 600m from this wonder of the world. Amarvilas is Sanskrit for 'eternal heaven', and when you step into its pools and gardens you will understand why. Built like a palace, Amarvilas is both mysterious and majestic. Mosaics and inlaid floors abound and nowhere more so than in the spa with its cobalt blue pool. MADIKWE SAFARI LODGE SOUTH AFRICA

Africa is said to be the heartbeat of the world. Madikwe Safari Lodge sits between two rolling hills surrounded by 76,000 hectares of game reserve. The Amalfi coastline is made for lovers, and since 1951 the Sensale family in Positano have been entertaining lovers from around the world with their Italian charm and delightful 'summer house'. La Sirenuse started with just eight rooms and a large terrace overlooking the islands of the Sirens. It now boasts 62 rooms clinging to the cliffs of Positano, with a private pool at sea level below.

The gilded dome of the village's Mother Church is close enough to touch and whitewashed walls prevail with colourful mosaic tiled floors to cool the feet. Stay in the luxurious suites in the original house for bathrooms overlooking the Mediterranean and balconies on which to breakfast.

The Sant'Antonio is the hotel's boat; it's all exposed timber and Italian-style for daytime cruising. If you prefer land to sea then explore nearby Ravello, a mountain top village. L'HOSTEL, PARIS
